NEW BUSINESS:

Proclamation of Support #2017-001 – Residents of Dexter-Chelsea Road: To show support the following proclamation #2017-001 was read:

PROCLAMATION OF SUPPORT FOR THE RESIDENTS OF DEXTER-CHELSEA ROAD- NON-MOTORIZED PATHWAY DISPUTE WHEREAS, more than 100 residents of Lima Township who live on Dexter-Chelsea Road, are being affected by the proposed non-motorized pathway,

WHEREAS, the "Boland corridor" in question was obtained by Mr. Boland in fee simple through multiple purchases of land, not through the acquisition of easements or rights-of way, and that many if not all of the instruments by which these property transfers were effected contain a reversion clause stipulating that the land in question would automatically revert to the adjoining land owner if it ceased to be used for railroad purposes for a specified amount of time (e.g. three consecutive years),

WHEREAS, those property owners holding a Warranty Deed or similar instrument of property transfer containing a reversion clause had every reason to believe it to be a valid document, and the document is to have extra merit by being duly recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds for Washtenaw County,

WHEREAS, the abandonment of all railroad activities on the corridor in question within the stipulated time frame triggered the reversion clauses in the aforementioned instruments, resulting in the automatic transfer of ownership to the adjacent landowners, irrespective of subsequent illegitimate claims,

WHEREAS, the proposed non-motorized pathway crosses in excess of fifty private driveways, two county roads, and two local roads, greatly increasing the probability of collisions leading to increased injuries and death,

WHEREAS, the proposed non-motorized pathway would traverse or be very close to garages, well heads, houses, and would disrupt the lives of these residents, and

WHEREAS, the proposed non-motorized pathway would destroy wetlands, old growth trees and desecrate a local, historical cemetery and run through our already disappearing agricultural lands,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Lima Township Board fully supports the residents with property adjacent to the Boland corridor in their dispute with the construction of the non-motorized pathway through their land.

PROCLAMATION FULLY SUPPORTED BY THE LIMA TOWNSHIP BOARD OF TRUSTEES 3/13/2017

Temporary Road Closures – Heart & Sole Annual Race, Resolution #2017-006: The following resolution was read aloud by Supervisor Maier:

WHEREAS, the Heart and Sole Run/Walk Race is a highly attended annual event in the Chelsea Community,

WHEREAS, by the nature of the event and for the safety of the participants, road closures are required,

WHEREAS, the Township of Lima has approved the temporary road closure of Trinkle Road between Freer and N. Fletcher Roads on Saturday, May 20, 2017 from 8:00 am until 11:30 am for this event; and

WHEREAS, the Driveways, Banners, and Parades Act 200 of 1969 requires the Township to authorize an official, designated by resolution, to make such request from the Road Commission.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Lima Township designates and agrees that Autumn Orta, of St. Joseph Mercy Health System, be the Authorized Official designated in this instance when application is made to the Washtenaw County Road Commission for the Heart and Sole Race on May 20, 2017 for temporary road closures.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, the Township will be provided a current \$5,000,000 liability insurance certificate with Lima Township as additional insured with respect to the Heart and Sole Race on May 20, 2017.

Lima Township Resolution for Poverty Exemption #2017-007: The following resolution was read aloud by Supervisor Maier:

WHEREAS, the adoption of guidelines for poverty exemptions is within the purview of the Township Board, and

WHEREAS, the homestead of persons who, in the judgment of the Supervisor and Board of Review, by reason of poverty, are unable to contribute to the public charges is eligible for exemption in whole or part from taxation under Public Act 390, 1994 (MCL 211.7u) and as amended by PA 620 of 2002; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to PA 390, 1994 and PA 620, 2002, Lima Township, Washtenaw County adopts the following guidelines for the Supervisor and Board of Review to implement. The guidelines shall include but not be limited to the specific income and asset levels of the claimant and all persons residing in the household, including any property tax credit returns, filed in the current or immediately preceding year,

To be eligible, a person shall do all of the following on an annual basis:

- 1. Be an owner of and occupy as a homestead the property for which an exemption is requested.
- 2. File a claim with the Supervisor or Board of Review, accompanied by federal and state income tax returns for all persons residing in the homestead, including any property tax credit returns filed in the immediately preceding year or in the current year.
- 3. Produce a valid driver's license or other form of identification if requested.
- 4. Produce a deed, land contract, or other evidence of ownership of the property for which an exemption is required, if requested.
- 5. Meet the federal poverty income standards as defined and determined annually by the United States Office of Management and Budget.
- 6. Have assets totaling no more than \$150,000, not including the primary residence.
- 7. The application for an exemption shall be filed after January 1, but before the day prior to the last day of Board of Review.
- 8. Any additional eligibility requirements as determined by the Township Board.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Board of Review shall follow the above stated policy and federal guidelines in granting or denying an exemption, unless the Board of Review determines there are substantial and compelling reasons why there should be a deviation from the policy and federal guidelines and these are communicated in writing to the claimant.

- Township still waiting to see if City of Chelsea wants to enter into 425 agreement for Wolf property.
