- Two Public Hearings were held on March 25, 2019 and were well attended by interested residents
- 1035 N. Fletcher (rezoning RR to LI) was back under old business. However, it was tabled until the April meeting when the applicant will present a formal list of limited uses to the Planning Commission.
- Public Hearing 58 S. Steinbach RD S.U.P. for off-premise landscaping and snowing plowing business.
- Public Hearing 555 S. Dancer RD S.U.P. for commercial horse stable, horse events, weddings and special events.
- All three applications will be on the April PC Agenda along with perhaps a couple more applications.
- With the amount of S.L.U.P. that are being applied for and approved the Master Plan, and even the ordinances are being lost sight of.

Western Washtenaw Recycling Authority (WWRA): Nanette Havens

- Prices are down on material especially cardboard. Not as much material is coming in compared to last year.
- D.E.Q. is offering a 25%/75% grant that WWRA is applying for to use the funds to purchase less labor intensive trucks (less men per truck) for in-town pick-ups. If enough trucks can be purchased it is possible that the prison labor force currently used at the transfer station may no longer be needed.
